STANDARD NO. 312

PROBLEM:

1. May the title examiner rely on the information on a Maine Real Estate Transfer Tax Declaration form ("RETTD"), or the lack of a "transfer tax paid" stamp in the margin, to determine if a recorded deed was *not supported by consideration*?

RECOMMENDATION:

1. No.

DISCUSSION:

Deeds do not need to be supported by consideration to be valid. However, whether a deed is supported by consideration may be important to determine if a grantee is protected by the Maine Recording Act.

Belanger v. Yorke, 2020 ME 24, 226 A.3d 215 was a recording act dispute that involved a deed filed with a RETTD where both parties to the deed stated under oath that the deed was a gift. The Law Court analyzed an oral agreement and remanded the case to the trial court on consideration issues without mentioning the RETTD.
